THREE REASONS WHY YOU SHOULD ATTEND

1. Increasing Federal Criminal Prosecutions

As Congress continues to enact legislation expanding federal criminal jurisdiction, the government is bringing more prosecutions in the Federal District Court.

2. Keep Up With Changing Federal Criminal Law And Procedure

New federal criminal legislation and amendments to the U.S. Sentencing Guidelines are enacted annually, generating new Supreme Court and appellate interpretations. Needing to keep abreast of these important changes that affect federal criminal trial and appellate practice is more important than ever in light of recent Supreme Court and Sixth Circuit opinions and the ongoing changes in sentencing law following the Supreme Court's opinion in *Booker*, *Rita*, *Gall*, and *Kimbrough*.

3. Satisfy Both Ohio Supreme Court And Federal District Court CLE Requirements
