SUMMARY OF PROGRAM

This program provides an overview aimed for use by service providers in the legal profession (lawyers, paralegals, investigators, mitigation experts, etc.) of what it means to have a client who is addicted to a chemical substance. In other words, what do those in the legal profession need to know to better understand the science behind addiction and substance abuse in order to better represent that client? This presentation is geared specifically to those in the legal profession who often deal with the chemically dependent or the chemically addicted. The goal is to improve representation of those clients by enhancing the professional's understanding from a medical perspective of the problems associated with substance abuse and addiction.
